Texts: • *Elementary Mathematics for Teachers*, by Thomas H. Parker and Scott Baldridge.

• *Primary Mathematics textbooks (U.S. Edition)* — Primary Mathematics 3A, 4A, 5A, and 6A and Workbook 5A. Students using this elementary school curriculum were tested as the best in the world. We will do many problems from these books.

It is hoped that all these books will also be useful after you begin your teaching career.

Goals: This course is a mathematics course focusing on elementary school mathematics. The main goal, of course, is to acquire a solid knowledge of that material. But an elementary school mathematics teacher needs to know much more, including: (i) how to present the material in the simplest, clearest way, (ii) the appropriate sequential order for developing mathematics skills, and (iii) what the students will find difficult and what errors they are likely to make, and (iv) how each topic helps advance the mathematical level of the students.

Expectations: Classes will be primarily lectures, with problem solving individually and in small groups. You are expected to take complete notes, to participate in class activities, and to ask questions about what you do not understand.

Evaluation: There will be three 50-minute Exams each worth 100 pts, several homework based Quizzes worth total of 100 pts (the two lowest will be dropped), a 200-pt uniform comprehensive Final Exam. That's a total of 600 pts for the course. Your total number of points will be converted into a percentage and your grade will be determined by the following grading scale:

90 – 100 %	4.0	70 - 74 %	2.0

Note: Once a graded exam leaves the classroom, the score can not be changed.

Attendance: You are expected to attend all meetings of the class. If you must miss a class, plan to get notes for that day from a classmate. Missing an exam without an advance valid excuse presented to the Instructor will result in a score of 0 pts. **No make – ups** are given. Commercial travel schedules are not excuses. There will be no make – up or excused Quizzes.

Any student having another final scheduled during the time of the uniform final exam time or having two other final exams scheduled the day of that exam may take the make-up exam, which will be given the next day. If you qualify for the make-up final exam, in order to take it you must fill out a request in A212 Wells Hall no later than Friday, 5/1 and provide a recent copy of your schedule as documentation. You will not be allowed to take the make-up final without registering. Students taking the make-up final exam MUST have a pictured ID.
